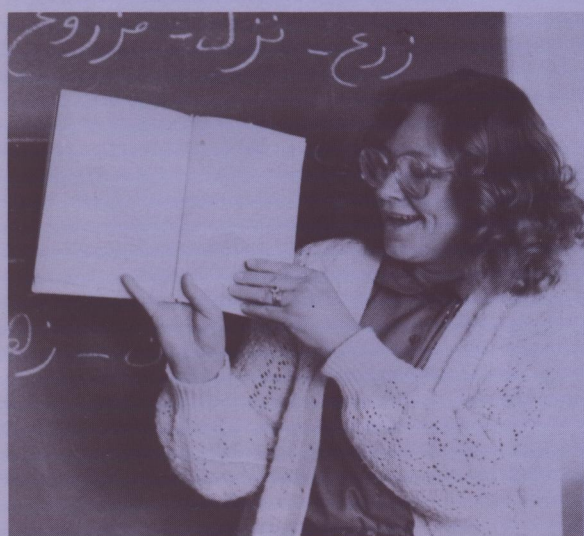


BOOK CLUB

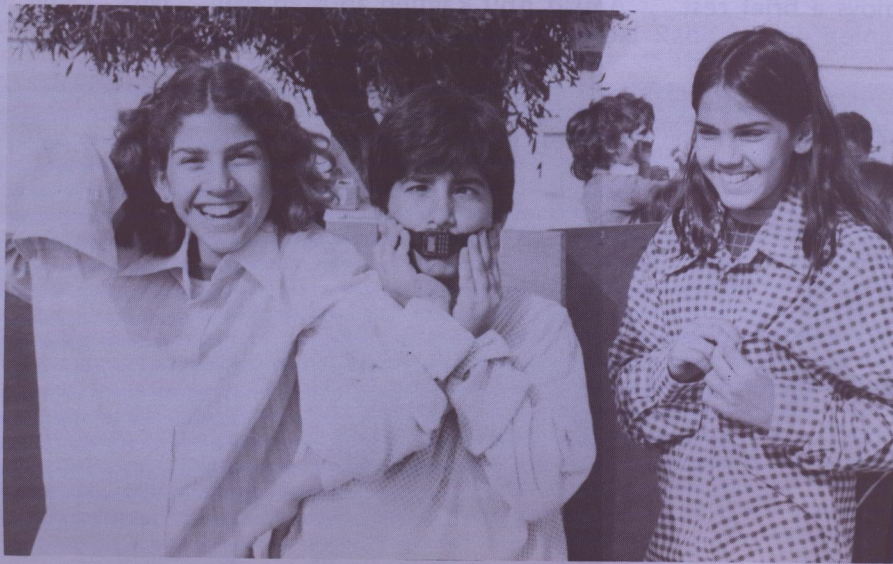

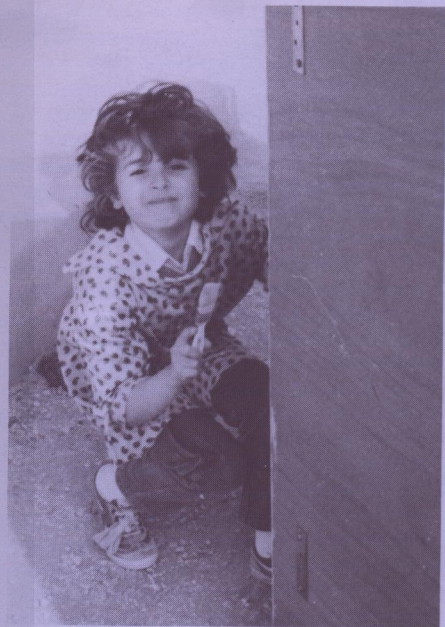

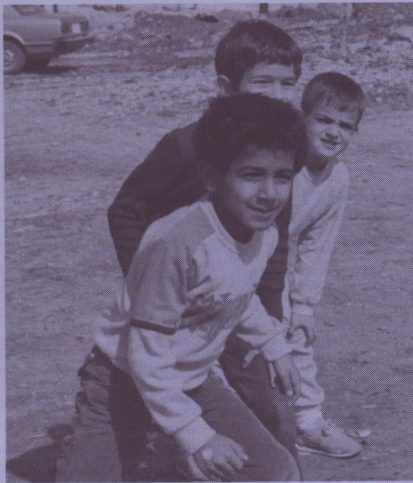

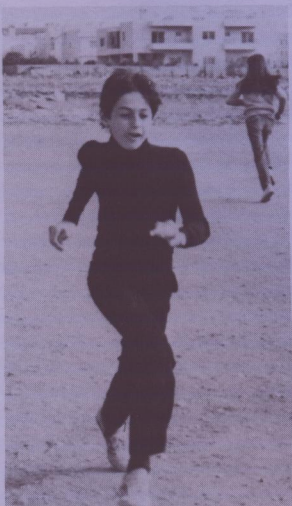

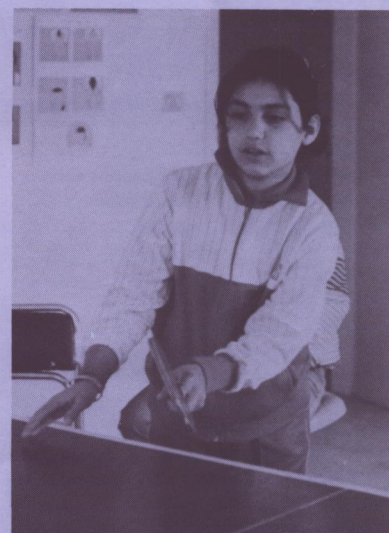

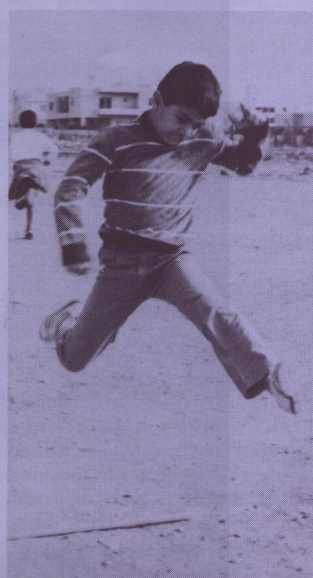

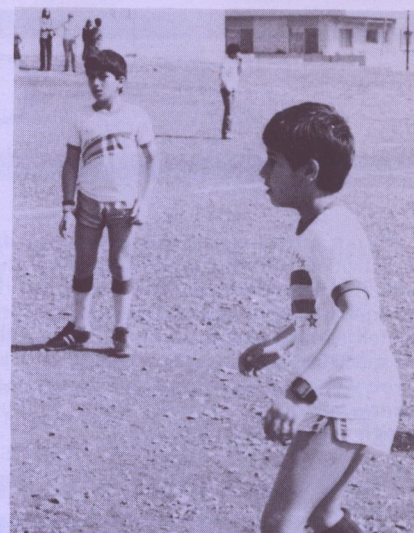

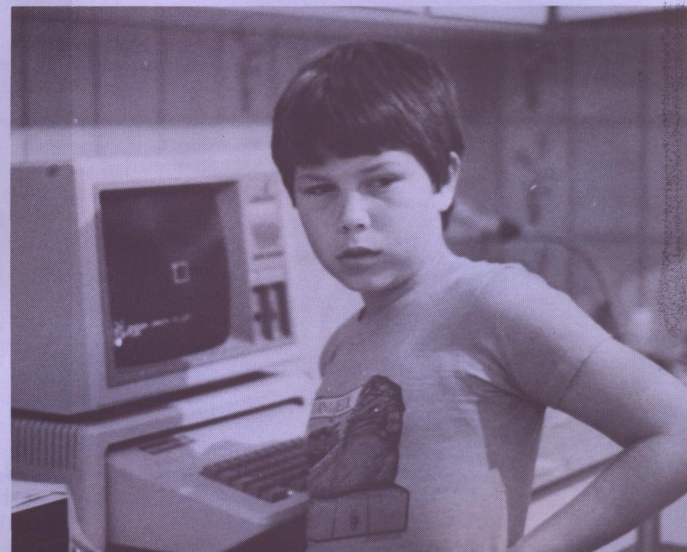

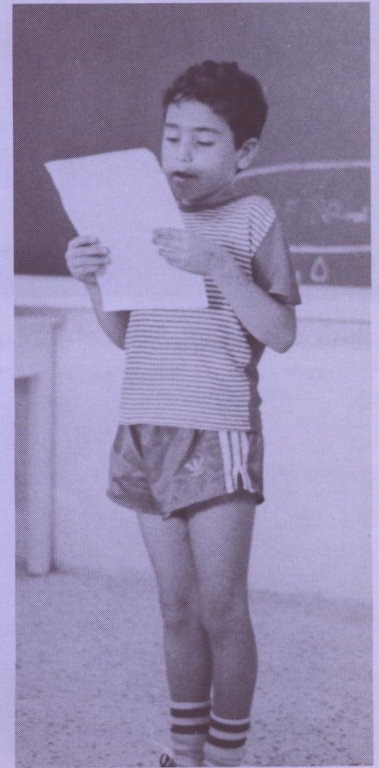

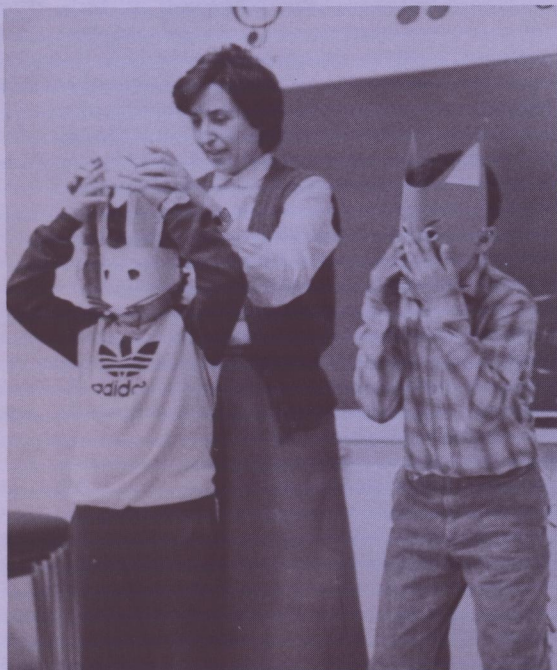

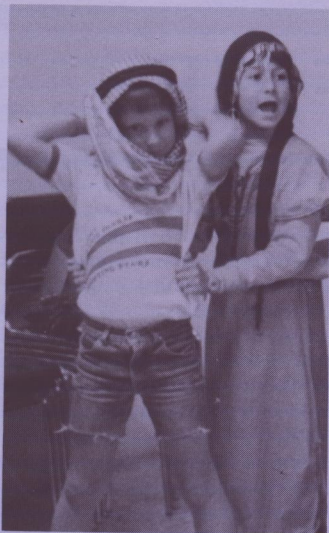

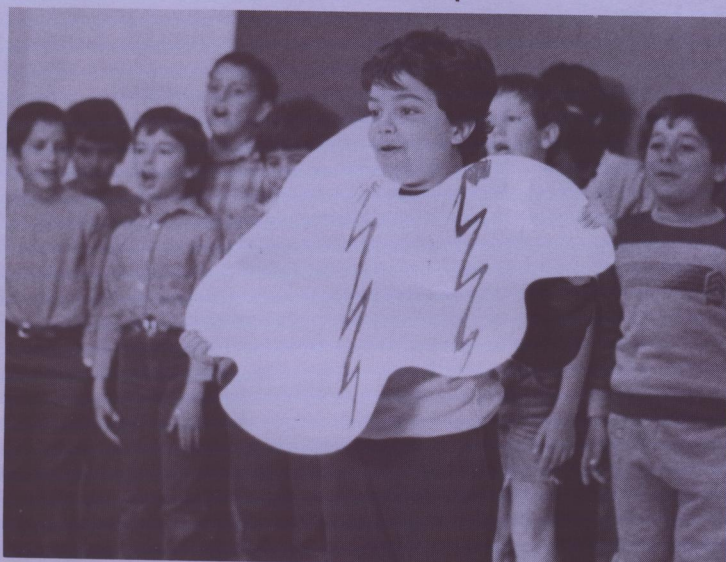

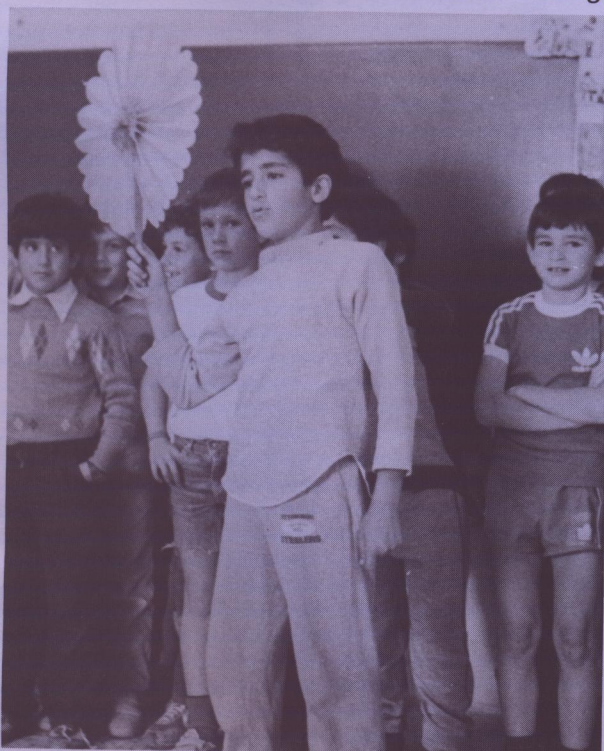

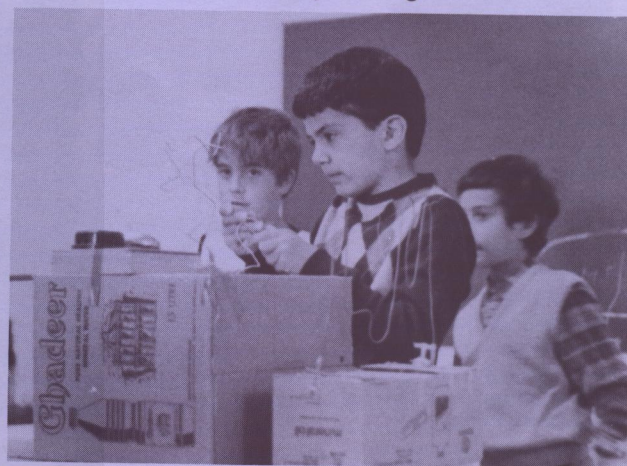
